This is a summary of the annual report for the SHEET METAL WORKERS' PENSION PLAN OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, ARIZONA AND NEVADA, Employer Identification Number 95-6052257, Plan Number 001, for the period January 1, 2007 to December 31, 2007. The annual report has been filed with the Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

BASIC FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Benefits under the plan are provided by a trust. Total plan expenses were \$73,836,585. These expenses included \$5,610,692 in administrative expenses and \$68,225,893 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries. A total of 10,242 persons were participants in or beneficiaries of the plan at the end of the plan year, although not all of these persons had yet earned the right to receive benefits.

The value of the plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$1,021,213,674 as of December 31, 2007, compared to \$979,978,244 as of January 1, 2007. During the plan year, the plan experienced a change in its net assets of \$41,235,430. This change includes unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's

assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The plan had total income of \$115,072,015 which included employer contributions of \$28,437,128, gain of \$57,307,488 from the sale of assets, unrealized loss from decrease in value of investments of \$226,400, earnings from investments of \$27,447,312 and miscellaneous income of \$2,106,487.

MINIMUM FUNDING STANDARDS

An actuary's statement shows that enough money was contributed to the plan to keep it funded in accordance with the minimum funding standards of ERISA.
